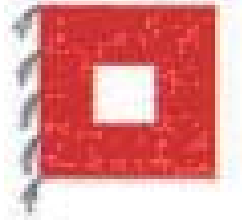
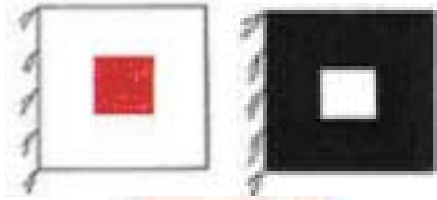
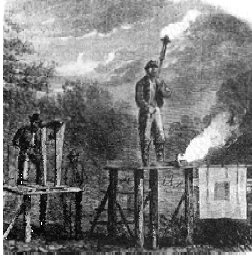


Signal flags catch attention!

When darkness set in, signal torches replaced the flags for better visibility.



Telegraphs were used to send coded messages across the country. Due to a shortage of men during the war, women were brought in to run the telegraph.

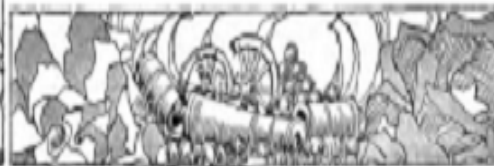
The Signal Corps offers you a perfect place to get your start in reenacting. We have people from all walks of life.



The organization is comprised of a military and civilian group. If you are interested in taking the field armed, you must be at least 16.



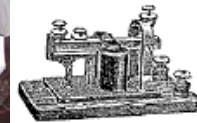
Some enjoy demonstrating history one on one; others would rather take the stage of the battlefield in front of crowds, while others prefer to remain behind the scene.
